I look forward to sharing in this profound journey with you, and to joyously celebrating Easter with you as well.

Last month, seven people completed MUMC's first Cell Ministry Leadership Training Program! For over four months, these men and women dedicated themselves to a comprehensive educational program that taught them how to more effectively take the joy of knowing and serving Jesus outside the church walls.

In case you've forgotten, cell ministry is a huge component of our Good to Great process because it helps our church become more intentional about making disciples of Jesus Christ. Cell ministry seeks to reach people in our community

by forming cell groups, or small, informal groups for fellowship, service, and discipleship. Cell groups are places where people can discover, develop, and deploy their gifts for ministry, as well as be transformed by the power and love of Christian community. Cell groups are designed to multiply. That is, cell groups don't exist as an end unto themselves; rather they continually seek to respond to Jesus' commission to "go and make disciples of all nations" (Matt. 28.19).

This month, keep your eyes and ears open for new cell groups popping up in your neighborhood!
