Siblings in Christ,

I've been thinking a lot lately about time and timing. As the popular saying goes, "timing is everything"—and there's a lot of truth to that, I think. I've been teaching my youngest daughter, Sybil, how to ride her pedal bike over the last few weeks without any training wheels and I've been trying to be very conscious of her timing while doing that. Pushing too hard too fast could leave her bruised up, anxious, traumatized; allowing her to remain forever attached to those old training wheels could leave her insecure, stunted, overly attached, and unwilling to venture out bravely later in life. The right timing, though, can really nurture confidence and personhood and allow that little face to smile with the joy of what she can accomplish. Finding just the right balance between pushing and encouraging and knowing when to back off and take a break is everything. Timing is everything.

We are nudging just a little closer to Easter as we enter into April and Easter has something profound to say about timing. Easter reminds us that there's something theological about good timing. Paul wrote to the Romans: "For while we were still weak, at just the right time Christ died for the ungodly" (Rom 5:6). At just the right time—the word in Greek there is *kairos*, which is often contrasted with *kronos* (regular chronological time). There's regular old time that marches by at its regular pace whether we like it or not, but then there's also the right time, the opportune moment, the time when everything seems to have aligned and become ready to go forward and thrive. That, Paul tells us, is just exactly when Christ died and rose on Easter—at just the right time. A large chunk of the Christian year is based around Easter in terms of *kronos*-time: Easter always comes on the first Sunday after the first full moon that falls on or after March 21 (called the Pascal Full Moon). From there, we can count back 46 days to Ash Wednesday and you have Lent, or forward 49 days and you have Pentecost. Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Ascension, Trinity Sunday—all of those are based on the date of Easter in a chronological sense. But the BIG question is whether Easter will fall this year at just the right time—when hearts are ready to receive it. Is your heart ready? There's still time to make ready. There's

still plenty of time in Lent to slow down and prepare. There's a lot going on at the church during Holy Week to find your way toward Easter's rhythm—Pot Luck on Holy Wednesday (6:30pm), our Maundy Thursday service (6:30pm), a Good Friday cantata led by our choir and for which we'll be joined by the First Congregational Church, Easter Sunrise service (at MUMC 6:30am), and, of course, our Easter services at the normal times. All these events are coming with the regular march of the calendar. How will you make sure, though, that it's arriving at the right time?


Our MUMC Family Out in the World

March, spring, aah!


Here is a sampling of the joy some of our MUMC family shared last month.

Why Christ Calls Us to Worship

Easter services are usually well attended, but what about other weeks? What draws you to worship on an “average” Sunday, and what might Jesus have in store for people in the pews?

Consider this from Pastor Charles Aaron: “Did we come to church this morning thinking it was a safe thing to do? Did we come with some expectation of receiving a blessing, a bit of comfort, but no real challenge? Did we think about the possibility that encountering Jesus would rearrange our lives, explode our priorities, cause us to give more than we ever expected? Did we think we could get a little something from Jesus, a dose of grace to help us through the week? Did we come for the fellowship, the music, the spiritual boost? No one can argue with those reasons.”

He continues: “The risen Christ, however, may have had other plans for this worship service. Christ may want to come under our skins and transform us. Christ may see through us so that something we have well hidden comes to the surface. Christ may kick out from under us the things we use to prop ourselves up but that we don’t really need. Are we ready for that? Did we bargain on that when we walked through the door today?”


