Pastor's Corner

Beloved in Christ,

Let me be the first to welcome you to Advent! I have to say for myself this year that I feel my heart exhaling a long, pent-up "at last" in finding myself here in this season because, in addition to being ready for lights and festivity, lately I have been sensing God's call to prayer and reflection on business that I take to be Advent business. Advent, of course, is the first season on the church year's calendar and, traditionally, its themes call us to ponder our preparations for the second coming of Christ and our ultimate hope as we make ready for Christmas (a making-ready for the second advent even as we prepare to commemorate the first), but it has often struck me that somewhere, tucked away in this season's spiritual invitation, is something that speaks universally to the human situation, something that addresses itself broadly to a core problematic of the life of the spirit. Call it waiting, call it hope, call it expectation, call it navigating the painful paradox of living between the already and the not yet. Martin Luther spoke of it in terms of living in two kingdoms at the same time. More simply put: advent is an invitation to engage in the hard spiritual work of centering our life today around hope and God's promises of joy and deliverance for tomorrow even while today remains a place of fears, discomforts, and blessings that may go unrecognized.

This year in Advent, I'm going to be spending some time with Mary. Think about it: Mary's pregnancy sort of typifies what Advent is about in a certain kind of way (even as it exemplifies some of its on-the-ground blessings and adversities). Mary's journey began with a future-oriented annunciation by an angel full of hope and promise and yet, very soon, Mary discovered how difficult living fully within the joy of that promise would be. She discovered that pregnancy is uncomfortable. She discovered that alongside its excitement for what's coming can also come fear and anxiety. She also discovered a unique sort of companionship in sharing her journey with a fellow traveler in her sister-in-law Elizabeth. Yet, all the while, Jesus' birth (his advent) was still on its way. For Mary (as for us) that end-result is something to celebrate, of course, but I find myself wondering what Mary and what Advent have to teach us about surviving and thriving spiritually along the way, and is there something about learning to survive and thrive on the way that prepares us for the joy at the end? I think there is and I think Mary might have a few things to

teach us about that. And so I don't just want to welcome you to Advent; I want to invite you into Advent. Through this season I'm going to be reviving our old Wednesday night gathering time as an occasion to pray and reflect on where God is among all the stuff we're carrying. We'll gather at 6:30pm for some time of reflection and prayer with some light desert refreshments. Of course, there are a number of other ways to enter into the journey around the life of the church this year—the Christmas fair, Bell Ringing, the Christmas concert. Whatever your way is of accepting this year's Advent invitation, I pray that it meets you with that same "at last" that it meets me with. May it be a time of refreshing, unburdening, remembering our hope and our joy. May it equip us with tools of the spirit for living a life that can be so full of so many blessings and challenges. May it be a season of reminding, recentering, and filling and may it truly be a blessing to all of your hearts.



Advent is upon us! Advent is the darkest time of the year in the northern hemisphere. We have fewer hours of daylight, and it gets cold! It's an actual time to slow down and *be still*. We know that God is present and with us in each moment. We quiet ourselves and wait for the Light of the world to be received into the world at Christmas.

Who can be still in the midst of Holiday parties and performances? Who has the inner quiet to pause and receive God's message in the midst of mayhem? Who trusts God is present with us in and through it all? I do. Yes, I do and you can too!


