Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends,

This edition of the Outreach finds MUMC in the midst of our annual stewardship education emphasis. This year's theme is "**Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity.**" One thing you may notice about this emphasis campaign is that it is what one might call "low key." There are no big church-wide meetings or home meetings, no glossy brochures, no videos, no dinners or desserts being offered. This is intentional, partly due to the fact that we fairly recently completed a capital campaign that was fairly intense, and partly due to the fact that like many of you, our church is trying to hold down unnecessary expenses.

But the fact that the "**Enough**" campaign is "low key" should not be interpreted as meaning that it is low priority. During the next few weeks we will be doing everything we can to provide our members and friends with resources and practical tools to assist you in the long-term goal of financial health and good order. We will also be providing theologically sound perspectives on our relationship with money, and as this year's emphasis suggests, the joy of living simply and generously.

And, of course, as part of our emphasis, we will be inviting our members and friends to make an estimate of giving of their financial offerings over the next twelve months (starting July 1). The Sundays when you will be invited to present your completed estimate of giving cards are set for **May 23 and May 30.**

So, then, what I am asking you to do is this: make every effort to attend worship over the next several Sundays, and as this stewardship emphasis period unfolds, prayerfully consider the changes God is asking you to make in your relationship with money and how you use it.

During the month of May your children will have the opportunity to prepare for Children's Sunday by becoming involved in one or more parts of the service: Skit, Sound Effects, Cooking and Art. The children's hand bell choir, sacred dance and the children's choir will also be performing.

Confirmation Class will be holding a morning retreat on May 15th at the church from 8:30-12:00 noon. This will be the last meeting of the group before June 6th, Confirmation Sunday.

The mission of our church is to help others discover the joy of knowing and serving Jesus Christ and what better place to start than with our own children and youth? We will be starting our teacher sign-ups for next year. Please look for our table in the outer lobby and volunteer.

We will be looking to fill the following positions for next year:

2 Teachers for each subject: Art, Cooking, Music, Story Telling, Games, Movie, Science or Computer.
-You will teach either the Pre-K class or the grade 1,2,3 class.
- You will be teaching about 4 Sundays during the whole year.

4 Shepherds: You will be in the classroom with either the Pre-K class or the grade 1,2,3 class. You do not need to teach or prepare any lessons. Your main job is to get to know the students in your group and support them in the classroom. We would like to have two shepherds per class so you can alternate weeks to give your family's schedule some flexibility.

2 or 3 Teachers for the 6,7,8th grade class: This class needs a team of 2 or 3 teachers willing to teach 3 weeks at a time and rotate with each other. We are adding the 6th graders to this group for next year.

2 or 3 Teachers for the 9-12 High School class: As with the two classes listed above we need a team of pro's here to teach our high school kids.
