A Message from the Pastor...

Dear Friends,

As a pastor who deals directly with people in need, I can tell you that I have never before experienced so many people coming to the office looking for assistance. The stream of folks looking for help tells me that many in our local communities are experiencing extreme economic distress right along with the rest of our nation. This coincides with recent studies that indicate two troubling trends--first, that more and more individuals and families in our nation are slipping into poverty, and second, that the income and wealth gap between the wealthiest and the rest of the population continues to grow.

In light of these realities, I felt a leading that it was time to address the issues of how we as followers of Jesus ought to respond to the needs of the poor from the pulpit. By the time this issue of the Outreach gets into your hands, I will have begun a sermon series entitled "Jubilee: God, the Church, and the Poor." In this series, we will be exploring some of the many biblical passages and principles that relate to those who are poor. Along the way, we will discover the Bible's perspective on how God views the poor, as well as looking at some of the fascinating ways that the people of ancient Israel sought to reduce poverty in their land, and at Jesus' teachings about the poor.

It is, it could be argued, appropriate that we look at the question of our relationship with the poor during this month when our thoughts turn towards gratitude for all we have. As I have often noted, there is a link between "thanks" and "giving" that is unmistakable. One of the chief ways in which we give thanks is through what we give--of ourselves, our resources, and our time. My hope is that through this series, and through our own personal study and reflection, we will all come to a place of greater willingness to give of ourselves in order to alleviate the suffering of others. I can think of no better way of saying "Thanks" to God.

November 5 will be a “happening night” at MUMC. The concert begins at 7 p.m. A freewill offering will be taken to help provide scholarships to our youth who attend the Wanakee United Methodist Center in Meredith, NH.

Grace Notes formed in late 2005 and is based in Bedford, NH. They have traveled and sung across NH at churches, camps, and also at the Concord State Prison. While their repertoire is largely Christian, you may hear them add some favorites from other genres from time to time. Their accompanist is Nancy Tong, and they will be joined by Jim Rudolf on the drums and Matt Young on bass.

The evening's format will be similar to last spring's hymn sing – we'll take hymn requests from the audience and intersperse them with songs performed by Grace Notes. If you have any particular hymns that you would like to sing that night that are not found in either of our hymnals, please let Nancy know ahead of time, so we can be prepared with music.




Do You Have a Name Badge?
