
Quilting Ministry

Dear Friends,

I used to be one of those folks who did not believe in making a big deal about making New Year's resolutions. I suppose my lack of enthusiasm about resolutions sprang from a cynicism about my own ability to keep any resolutions I might make, and I had plenty of evidence to bolster that cynicism in my own life and in the lives of those around me. But I have come to appreciate the value of even aborted attempts to resolve to make needed changes in one's life. As I have gotten older, certain habits have become more and more entrenched and require that I gather all the more "umph" to change. I have learned that I need to grab hold of anything and everything available in order to overcome the inertia that threatens to overtake me. If the New Year provides me with even the slightest incentive to make a change or begin a new habit, I'll take it!

Another thing I have learned is that there is something powerful in committing to change alongside others. I find that if I can find other people to join me in making a particular resolution, I have a much better chance of keeping that resolution, as do the people who are making it with me. The more we share the struggles and triumphs, the more we allow others to hold us accountable, the more strength we are able to receive and share for the journey. Over and over again, I have seen God use community to bring about the transformation that he desires to bring about in all of our lives.

So, where am I going with all of this? You may have already heard that I am resolving to **read the Bible in its entirety in 2007**, from start to finish. That's one of my resolutions for the New Year. But **I am looking for 50 people to**

join me in doing so as well. If you have been feeling a need to take a step to deepen your faith life, perhaps this is a way for you to do just that. Here's how it works. Call the church office at 673-2669 and let someone in the office know that you are joining me in reading the Bible in one year (or leave a message.) Reading schedules will be available at the office, or if you prefer, you can go to "The One Year Bible OnLine" website,

www.oneyearbibleonline.com. There you will find the schedule of readings for each day. Daily readings in and of themselves can be completed in about 15-20 minutes, so if you are diligent in keeping to the reading schedule, you should be able to fit this discipline into your daily life without too much difficulty. And in the process, you will be opening up a space in your daily schedule to let God speak to you through his Word. If you want to talk about what you are reading, there will be a monthly meeting at 7:30 on the 4th Sunday night of each month at the church.

I hope you will pray about being a part of this year-long journey through the Scriptures with me! In the meantime, my prayer for all our members and friends is that you will have a truly blessed 2007.


- The Christian flag has been purchased in Honor of Philemene Ruonala by Carol & Cecil Rowlette and Jack & Gail Ruonala.

REMEMBER our Christmas Eve services last year at the Boys and Girls Club? We had a potted Christmas tree that was donated by a member of our church family. Spotlight on Bible Studies


Fancy Flakes

Make a snowflake as unique and as special as you are in God's eyes.




What you need:

- paper (plain white or glittery wrapping paper)
- round plate or saucer (about the size you want your snowflake)
- pencil, crayon or marker
- scissors
- glitter
- glue stick
- hole punch
- ribbon or yarn



What you need to do:

1. Draw a circle on a piece of paper by tracing around the plate or saucer.
2. Cut out the circle.
3. Fold the paper in half three times. (If the paper is thick, fold it just twice.)
4. Use your scissors to carefully cut out shapes from the folded paper.
5. Unfold your paper.
6. On one side, write some things that are special about you.
7. Decorate the other side using the glue stick and glitter.
8. When the glitter is dry, punch a hole in the snowflake.
9. Put ribbon or yarn through the hole, and tie it to make a hanger.

OUR CHURCH ...An Important Re-
minder**

Please help trustees to make our building secure and energy efficient. If you are the last person leaving the building you are responsible for making sure that all lights are off, coffee pot is off and ALL exterior doors are locked (this includes the exit doors at the end of each wing and in the sanctuary). There have been a few occasions when the building has been left unlocked overnight. We cannot let this happen. If you are the last to leave PLEASE, at the very least, lock all doors.

There is a panic bar key on a pink key ring on the heat registers as you leave the narthex. Use this key to disengage the panic bars. If the panic bar is pushed in this means the door is unlocked. If you push on the panic bar and it moves in this means the door is locked. If you do not have a code to set the security alarm that is okay, but do not leave the building unlocked even if you think there is a group coming in after you. If the alarm is not activated, please call Dick Randlett, Everett Gale or Pastor Tom to let them know that the alarm is not on. BOTTOM LINE, if there is no one in the building at the time you leave the BUILDING IS TO BE LOCKED, NO EXCEPTIONS.
