A Window of Inspiration
will Grace our Sanctuary

Building a stained glass window for our Church Sanctuary is becoming a reality, in fact as early as spring! We now have a beautiful/inspiring design before us from Renaissance Glassworks of Nashua. We are very fortunate, because Kathleen Frank, a talented artist, has provided our committee with a custom drawing, which is very compelling. Kathleen and her husband, Mark are owners of Renaissance Glassworks in Nashua and residents of Milford. They have a passion for creating beautiful stained glass artwork and have been in business for 25 years, recently moving from their Main Street location, to a larger studio in one of the old mills.

The Design Team, a subgroup within the Building Committee has spent a year and a half exploring options for having a stained glass window built. After looking at countless designs on the Internet and in print, visiting churches, exploring the option of stained glass overlays (colored plastic film) VS real stained glass, we have reached a decision, which we hope will delight and inspire everyone. Two non-Building

Committee people, Chuck Worcester and Priscilla Abdinoor (an interior designer) recently joined our team, which includes Building Committee members, Everett Gale (a graphic designer), Carolyn Bowman, Keith Ladeau and Diane Jaquith.

Here is what a member of our committee shared within our group:

“In viewing the design for the first time - my feelings of WOW took over for a brief time - then as the image settled into my senses, the reality of Christ and a sense of Peace seemed to come over me”. “My opinion is that this design "works" for us as a Church family.”

The final cost of our new stained glass window will be \$7, 000. Since the window is being funded entirely by extra gifts and donations from interested people, we wish to extend a sincere thank you to all those who have faithfully contributed to the fund.

We will be working with Kathy during the design phase, and are excited about the prospect of showcasing a beautiful new window in the spring of 2007.

February 2007 Outreach

Dear Friends,

Around the time of the deadline for this issue of *The Outreach* we, like many of you, experienced a power outage. And when I say we, I mean both the church and my family. Both the church and the parsonage were without power for about 14 hours. I know that many of our members and friends were in the cold and dark for much longer than that, and that, in fact, some of you were in difficult and unhealthy situations as the outage continued. For us, it was short enough to be little more than an annoyance. But even so, we were some relieved when power was restored.

I heard how one of the folks who is connected to the church had the experience of their building's pipes freezing and bursting in the middle of the power outage. I can't even imagine what it must have been like trying to salvage one's belongings and clear up the flooding in the cold and dark. They say hell is a place of fire and heat, but I wouldn't have blamed the folks in that building if they imagined that hell was cold, dark, and wet.

What happens when the power goes out? I've been thinking about that since we lost our power. What happens when we lose focus or when we stop tending to the fire of the Spirit, or when the freezing rains of life cause us to waiver or even lose faith? What happens when the power goes out?

Things freeze up and stop working, and we don't have the light we need to see or the heat we need to stay warm. That's what happens.

It happens in buildings and homes, and it happens in human hearts. We need to stay connected to the power source, because when we lose that connection, when the lights go out, when the heat kicks off, when the well stops pumping, bad things happen.

The big difference between our souls and our homes is our souls have a Power Source that never goes out. This Power Source is not subject to the winds and the weather. It keeps generating power no matter what. We don't need to worry about God doing his job. But we do need to tend the flames of the Spirit, to feed the fire, to stay connected.

The staff at MUMC is committed to helping folks get connected and stay connected to God's power in their lives. Just this month, we are offering several new opportunities for you to grow spiritually, along with all the ongoing opportunities that you are welcome to participate in. Near the end of the month, Lent will begin, and with it a number of additional worship, study, and service activities. Information about some of these offerings will be included in this newsletter, but you will also want to watch the weekly bulletins or check out our website at www.milfordumc.org. Let's keep the power moving through our lives and through our church!



Spotlight on Children in Worship

Children are a vital part of the Milford United Methodist Church and we take our role as teachers and nurturers of their faith seriously. We have many different learning opportunities and programs available for children of all ages to participate in.

During both worship services we have qualified paid staff who provide quality child care. We offer Nursery care for infants and young children up to age 2-1/2 and Toddler care for children ages 2-1/2 through kindergarten. Children are welcome to attend worship in the sanctuary if parents wish, and there are crayons and coloring pages located in the back of the sanctuary to keep little ones busy. The service is audible in the lobby if a parent and child wish to take a break or shake some wiggles out.

For older children during the 10:45 service we offer Jr. Church (ages 2-1/2 through kindergarten) and Kingdom Kids (grades 1-5). Children are dismissed to their own learning time just after the Children's Sermon. Again, children can remain in the service and worship with their parents, or attend one of these two programs as the family wishes.

We also welcome children into important roles in the service. On any given Sunday children can be Acolytes (light the candles at the beginning of worship), Ushers, Greeters, and/or Lay Readers (read the announcements and Bible lesson during worship). We also have two

Children's Choirs: The Son Beams (for ages 3-7) and Trinity Doves (ages 1st grade and up). The choirs meet after school on Mondays. We have a Youth Handbell choir that rehearses at 5:00 pm on Thursdays. And new this year is the Sacred Dance Troupe (for kids ages 5 – 15) meeting at 4 pm on Thursdays. Educational opportunities for our children are Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and Confirmation. For fun and fellowship we have Youth Group, and different activities each year like the Easter egg hunt.

The Milford United Methodist Church exists to help people, including our children, discover the joy of knowing and serving Jesus Christ. If you would like to be a part of our ministry to and for children, or if you have any questions, please call Pastor Tom (673-2669). In some ways, he's the biggest kid of us all!

Here is how it works:

- 1) Sign up on the Flower Chart in the foyer for the Sunday you want to purchase flowers.



FYI Winter Storm Policy



Up until now, we have been blessed with a very mild winter. However, we know that situation could change any moment, and it likely that we will face a major snow storm sometime during this winter season. In the past, it has been Pastor Tom's policy not to cancel Sunday worship services in the event of bad weather. However, now that our church is located considerably further away from the parsonage, he has had to rethink this policy. He will still do everything humanly possible to get to church each Sunday morning, but he is less confident that there will not be a time when he will not be able to get to the church. In the event that worship is canceled, we will do our best to alert the local media so that they may include our church in their scrolling list of cancellations. We have already made arrangements with WMUR (channel 8 for most area residents) and will also attempt to be in touch with channels 4, 5, and 7 in the near future.

Congregation members can currently access the closing info by:

1. watching **WMUR (channel 8 for most area residents)** , the ticker at the bottom of the screen will run at 15 minutes and 45 minutes past each hour.
2. going to **wmur.com** and clicking the closing list on the left hand side to read the listings.

On Sundays when there is snow on the ground but when worship is not canceled, members and friends are encouraged to use their own discretion as to whether or not they can and should attend, and we will understand entirely those who choose to stay home, or who cannot get plowed out in time enough to get to worship.
