On those Sundays when there is snow on the ground but worship is not canceled, members and friends are encouraged to use their own discretion as to whether they can or should be attending worship that particular Sunday.

Dear Friends,

Lent, which begins unusually early this year, is a time when we are invited to intentionally step up our spiritual lives in hopes of becoming more deeply connected and committed to Christ. This year, MUMC will be offering a number of opportunities to help you along the way.

Among the programs we will be offering during Lent is something we are calling the MUMC Prayer Project. The goal of the MUMC Prayer Project is to help all of our members and friends (and friends of members and friends), deepen their connection to God through deepening their capacity to pray. If you are like me, developing and maintaining a consistent prayer life is a real challenge, and MUMC wants to help us meet that challenge.

Here is what is in store for you this February and March:

1. **Weekly Lenten Mini-Retreats** (as described on page 12 in this issue of The Outreach). Starting February 6, join us for any and all of these Wednesday evening gatherings. Each Mini-Retreat will help you learn a new and different way of praying and getting closer to God. We'll start at 6:30 with a simple soup supper, followed by the retreat itself at 7:00. (I should mention that we will not be having an Ash Wednesday service this year, but will be offering the first retreat that evening instead.)
2. **"Workbook on Living Prayer" Lenten Study**; I will once again be leading a six-week Lenten study on Saturday mornings from 9:00-10:30 starting on Saturday, February 9. As the name of the study suggests, each participant will be given a workbook with brief daily readings and prayer exercises. Then we'll gather each week to share what we have experienced and learned. Sign up today by emailing the church at MUMC2@aol.com, calling the church at 673-2669, or putting your name on the signup sheet in the foyer. We are requesting that each participant make a \$10 contribution for the cost of the workbook.

I hope that you will make every effort to participate in these opportunities, and that you will have a peaceful, quiet, and faith-deepening Lent.

As you are all aware MUMC is taking part in the "Good To Great" process. Curtis Brown from the New England Conference is guiding us through the logistics of the process and those of us on the diagnostic team are very thankful for his guidance.

This initiative is designed to help us move our church from a good church to a great church. The diagnostic team is gathering data that will help us understand the current state of the church and help us see our strengths and weaknesses so that we might become a church that is bringing the kingdom of God to the world in the way God has planned for us to do it. That friends is the key to this process and to get there we need the help of every member of the church. We need you to pray for at least these four things: 1. Make these fun heart treats to share with some of your neighbors.

What you need:

- Saucepan
- 2 tablespoons of butter
- 2 or 3 bags of miniature marshmallows
- 4 cups of crisp-rice cereal (regular or chocolate)
- 9 x 13 pan
- Heart-shaped cookie cutter
- Bag of chocolate chips (milk or white chocolate)
- Bowl
- Zipper sandwich baggie
- Scissors


What you do (with adult help):

1. Melt butter in saucepan and add marshmallows.
2. Stir until mixture becomes difficult to stir anymore. Mix in cereal and stir.
3. Butter the 9 x 13 pan and spread the mixture evenly in it. Allow to cool.
4. When cool, use cookie cutter to cut out heart-shaped treats.
5. Melt chocolate chips in a bowl in the microwave.
6. Spoon melted chocolate into a baggie. Cut off a corner and drizzle chocolate over the treats.

2nd Mission Trip to Katrina devastated areas being planned

Our church is in the planning stages for a week-long mission trip to Katrina devastated areas in the South in late October or early November. If you missed the trip last year, you have another chance! Dave Stackpole, the fearless leader of our first Mission trip, is in the planning stages for our church to go back to New Orleans and work in the Lower 9th Ward. The Lower 9th Ward was severely affected by the storm and is still in great need of help. If you have thought about this at all, please talk to any of the MUMC members who went last year, they were Pastor Tom, Tami Davis-Betelak, Rita Lines, Steve Rafter, Tim Herlihy, Lonni Stapanon, Sylvia Crosbourne, Gail and Ed Hernandez. It was a life changing experience.

Here are some of the things a potential team member should know:

We need about 20 people to make up a team. We will need a **team leader** – who takes the administrative responsibilities for our team; an **assistant team leader**; a **site team leader** – someone with construction experience; a **base camp commander** – one who purchases the food and does the cooking or all can share these duties; an **equipment manager** – makes sure we have everything we need to work and it is in good working order; a **designated listener** – possibly one of our Stephen Ministers; and lots of **workers of all skill levels**. Mostly you need to be a team player, be trainable, positive and a good listener.

- You will need to attend a training session to be given at our church.
- It will cost roughly \$240 per person for transportation, food while on site and lodging, more if you want to fly down. Right now air fare to the region is \$238 out of Boston, and \$318 out of Manchester, but could go up at any time.
- You must be at least 14 years of age or older. No one under the age of 14 will be allowed to go, even with a parent.
- You do not need to be a member or regular attendee of MUMC, we will be opening this trip up to the community and to other churches. Invite a friend!

Lenten Prayer Project - Learning Different Ways to Pray

Many of us would love to have a deeper prayer life but we just don't know how to go about doing so. If that describes where you are in your spiritual life, you will want to make sure to participate in MUMC's Lenten Prayer Project. Here is what's on tap!

Each Wednesday evening during Lent we will be hosting a Mini-Retreat focusing on different ways to pray. These retreats are planned so that the whole family can participate and will help folks deepen their prayer lives. You can attend a few or all of the retreats. Each evening we will begin at 6:30 with a light supper, and then, starting at 7:00 a time of prayer led by Pastor Tom, followed by an activity that is designed to help us think about prayer in a new way, and experience new ways of praying. Each mini-retreat will end at 8:00. Here are the topics of each mini-retreat.

February 6th -- Ash Wednesday – Pray in Color – make a prayer journal that you can use for the rest of this project.

February 13th -- Gratitude – we have so much to be grateful for, but sometimes we forget. Make a Valentine for God, or for someone in your life you're grateful for.

February 20th -- Forgiveness – the flip side of gratitude is forgiveness. Do you need to forgive yourself or someone else? We'll have a unique activity to aid in this process.

February 27th -- Prayer bracelets – do you ever have trouble focusing during prayer? Come create your own prayer bracelet that can serve to center your thoughts.

March 5th -- Walking/Labyrinth – meditation and exercise have worked together for centuries to focus our thoughts on God.

March 12th -- Silence and writing – whether you write in your prayer journal, or write to someone else, this mini-retreat is an opportunity to say the things that are in your heart.
