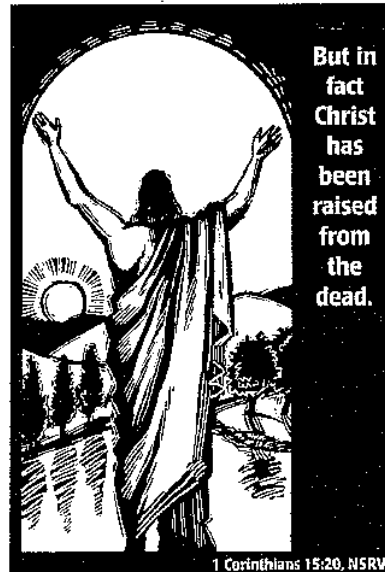

Dear Friends,

By the time you are reading this, we will be in the midst of Holy Week, and will soon be celebrating our first Easter in our North River Road sanctuary. My prayer for each one of us is that we will truly experience God's presence in the midst of the recounting of these momentous events in the life of Jesus—his triumphal entry into Jerusalem, his last supper, his agony in the garden, his trial, crucifixion, and death, and then, of course, his victory over death.

My best advice is to enter into Holy Week and into Easter with a sense of expectation. Believe that God is waiting for you in and through these ancient celebrations and all that is entailed in marking this holy season. Trust that in each moment there is the potential for God's love and grace to transform your life, and change you from the inside out.

Ultimately, that is what Easter is all about -- transformation. As Paul puts it in I Corinthians 15:51, "*We will not all die, but we will all be changed.*" Of course, he is speaking of the final resurrection, when our bodies take on the full weight of glory. But that does not mean that we cannot experience foretastes of that blessed event in the here and now. And it all starts with our being open to what God has for us.

So, as I said, I hope that you and I will enter into Holy Week and Easter prepared for whatever God has in store.

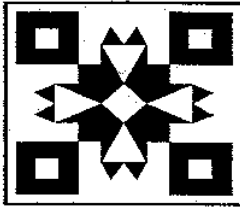
See you in church!

Still discovering the joy,

This year's confirmation process has begun in earnest! Once again we are using the Making Disciples confirmation resource. One feature of this resource is that each young person who decides to participate in confirmation is matched with a confirmation mentor. A mentor is an adult member of our church who has agreed to accompany a confirmand through the thirteen week process leading to Confirmation. The program is based upon the assumption that one of the primary ways most of us learn about and grow in the Christian faith is by "looking over the shoulder" at older, more experienced Christians. The mentors who have volunteered to work with our confirmands are not so much "experts" as they are folks who are living out their faith from day to day and are willing to share that lived-out faith with a young person. Mentors will be meeting with their confirmands frequently, using the Making Disciples resources as a guide. Eventually, the young persons who are participating in confirmation will have the choice of whether to become full members of the church. This year's confirmands and their mentors are:

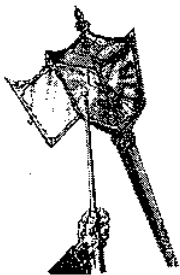
Time for Camp!

Teen Independent Living Skills Class Begins

On March 21st, Pastor Tom led the first class of an 8-week curriculum to help young people to become aware of what it really takes to live on their own independently – how to get a job, an apartment, stay in school, practice safe sex, have a checking account, get a car, etc. Alexis Eaton and Heather Leach will be presenting later on in the series.

This first group of students came to us from the Milford court system. It was a shock to some of us helping with the class to think of how much trouble a 14 or 15 year old kid can get into, and how helpless they already feel to make real changes in their lives. I am asking you to pray for these kids, their families, and those of us leading the class to be able to help them. I also ask that if you can help to be a mentor, or possibly a presenter for the class that you talk to me. Imagine being a young person and thinking that already your life is leading you to prison and that you have no hope. I don't believe that any child of God should believe that they aren't worth something to someone. These kids have made mistakes, let's help them see that they can overcome those mistakes and lead productive lives.

Christian Education

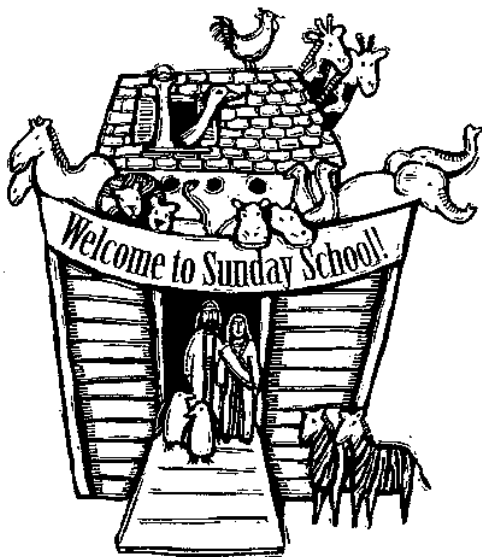

Church World Service (CWS) CROP-WALKS are about people working and walking together to take a stand against hunger in our world. Together we raise awareness and funds for international relief and development, as well as local hunger-fighting. Locally, 25% of the funds raised help to support the efforts of SHARE in Milford and the Open Cupboard Food Pantry in Wilton.

Last year's Souhegan Valley CROP-WALK raised \$30,598 and had a total of 298 walkers. Of the total walkers, 82 were from MUMC! With the option of doing the 10K or the 2 mile loop, we have set our goal to reach triple digits this year.....100 walkers from MUMC! We need YOU to be an important part of the MUMC CROPWALK TEAM.

Mission Trip to Katrina devastated areas being planned

Our church is in the planning stages for a week-long mission trip to Katrina devastated areas in the South in late October or early November. If you have the desire to go with our team, or know someone who is interested, or if you're interested in other short-term mission trips, please call Susan Drew (672-4877). We will be scheduling our preliminary meeting soon.

Here are some of the things a potential team member should know:

- We need about 20 people to make up a team. We will need a **team leader** – who takes the administrative responsibilities for our team, an **assistant team leader**, a **site team leader** – someone with construction experience, a **base camp commander** – one who purchases the food and does the cooking or all can share these duties, an **equipment manager** – makes sure we have everything we need to work and it is in good working order, a **designated listener** – possibly one of our Stephen Ministers, and lots of **workers of all skill levels**. Mostly you need to be a team player, be trainable, positive and a good listener.
- You will need to attend a training session to be given at our church.
- It will cost roughly \$240 per person for transportation, food while on site and lodging, more if you want to fly down. Right now air fare to the region is \$238 out of Boston, and \$318 out of Manchester, but could go up at any time.
- You must be at least 14 years of age or older. No one under the age of 14 will be allowed to go, even with a parent.
- You do not need to be a member or regular attendee of MUMC, we will be opening this trip up to the community and to other churches. Invite a friend!

Stained Glass Window is Dedicated

On Saturday, March 17 at 4:00 p.m. a new stained glass window had been installed in our sanctuary and was dedicated by the congregation with the creating artists present.

The Design sub-committee of the Building Committee has been working on this project for many months and had asked Renaissance Glassworks now located at 99 Factory Street in Nashua to design a window "that was contemporary but not too contemporary, traditional but not too traditional." The owners of Renaissance Glassworks, Mark and Kathleen Frank who live in Milford, designed and made the window at their business in Nashua and transported and installed it on Friday, March 16.


The central motif of the window is a cross, but the rest features abstract patterns of sky, leaves, a ribbon, mountains and ideas that have to be interpreted by the viewer. The window catches the sun from the South and faces North River Road for all to see.

The cost of this window has been fully funded by donations from interested persons and is a wonderful addition to our worship area.
