Dear Friends,

As many of you know, our church has had the honor of being invited by our conference to be the pilot church for a process called “Good to Great” (G2G). We were selected out of the 550 or so United Methodist Churches in the New England Conference to be the first church to participate in this process. It is certainly an honor to be recognized in this way, and I want to celebrate with you the fact that we have been asked to be the first church to participate in this process. Even if we had chosen not to participate, it would have been something to be feel good about. But I am excited to announce that, after much prayer, consideration, and conversation, our church council has agreed to be the first G2G congregation!

As the name implies, G2G is designed to assist churches that are “good” to become “great” churches. So, then, the question becomes, what is a great church? To quote the brochure that describes the G2G process, “Great churches are those pivotal congregations where transformative leadership, radical innovation, deep faithfulness, and disciplined action meet. Great churches produce miraculous fruit for the Kingdom. They are the churches that begin hospitals, universities, advocacy groups, or new churches. They are the churches that develop new and innovate ways of being in ministry with new people in a rapidly changing culture. They are the churches that produce whole generations of leaders that serve Christ in thousands of ways throughout their lives in all kinds of churches and ministries. They are the churches that change hundreds of lives everyday in their local community and through their connections around the globe. They are the churches that other church leaders visit for inspiration, ideas and hope.”

The G2G process will combine hard work, prayer, commitment, and openness on our part with the support, resources, attention, and prayers of our Bishop, District Superintendents, and conference staff to help MUMC continue on its journey towards becoming a great church. It will help us identify our strengths more clearly and to build upon them, but it will also help us look closely at our challenges and weaknesses so that we

can shore up and strengthen those areas. It will help us identify the leaders and training we will need to keep moving forward, and it will connect us with churches facing similar challenges, as well as inviting us to mentor churches that are seeking to grow stronger and deeper.

You will be hearing more and more about G2G in the months to come, but for now, I want to invite you to do two things:

1.) If you have not done so already, take a close look at the information posted on our website about G2G (you can access the G2G brochure at <http://www.milfordumc.org/forms/g2g.doc> or <http://www.milfordumc.org/forms/g2g.pdf>).

2.) pray for our church and for the G2G process, for those who will be providing leadership to this process, and for God’s guidance throughout this important journey.

For a long time now, I have believed that God has big plans for our church, and so much of what has happened over the last several years has only served to confirm that belief. My sense is that G2G is coming along at exactly the right time to help us build on the momentum that has been created, and to lean more radically into the future that God intends for us to experience. We stand at the threshold of greatness—and it is exciting and scary and daunting and thrilling all at the same time. But God is there, and will be there throughout this process, of that we can be sure.

### Crop Walk 2007

Crop Walk 2007 turned out to be truly remarkable day. God blessed us with the perfect day to walk on behalf of those that must walk. The weather was beautiful and the people responded in record numbers. This years Crop Walk reached beyond expectations in both numbers of walkers and money raised. This will benefit work programs to help eliminate hunger both at home and around the world. The community witnessed over 375 walkers from the surrounding congregations. Those walkers delivered hundreds of sponsors totaling thousands of dollars. We shattered the goal of \$32,500 by bringing in over \$35,000 to help eliminate world hunger.

As always 25% of the money will stay right here in the Souhegan Valley to assist those in need. SHARE and the Open Cupboard will benefit greatly from the walk. And once again MUMC can be proud of the fact that we again led the way with participation and enthusiasm.

Last year we had MUMC bandannas everywhere and this year they were out in force again. We did not reach our goal of 100 walkers from MUMC, but we did set a new high with a total of 88 walkers. 88 walkers with yellow and orange in sight everywhere you looked.

Tami and I want to again thank everyone who participated in making this event such a success. Walkers, sponsors and those that lifted the event up in prayer contributed to make 2007 a record year in every way. We are already working on ideas to make 2008 even more memorable.

# A Verse Frame

Make this special gift for your dad, uncle, grandfather or father-figure. It is nice to be reminded of our heavenly Father's love for us.

**What you need:**

- Piece of craft foam (8½" x 11", any color)
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Piece of paper (8½" x 11", any color)
- Pencil, crayons or marker
- Foam shapes, stickers (optional)
- Glue
- Hole punch
- Ribbon or yarn



**What you do:**

1. Use your ruler to measure a rectangle inside the piece of craft foam. Draw the rectangle, and then cut it out. Your foam should now look like a frame.
2. Place the piece of paper under the foam frame, and trace the shape of the frame's window onto the paper.
3. Choose a verse to write inside the rectangle on your paper. (Your frame can go horizontally or vertically.) Suggested verses include 1 Corinthians 8:6, Philippians 4:20 and 1 John 3:1.
4. Turn the frame over (face down), and put glue around the edge. Lay the verse face down on the back of the frame, and let it dry.
5. Decorate the outside of the frame with foam shapes, stickers or drawings.
6. Use your hole punch to punch two holes at the top of the frame. Tie a piece of ribbon or yarn through the holes to hang the frame.
