
We know that there are people all around us who have not discovered the joy of knowing and serving Jesus Christ, and this is a wonderful opportunity for you to reach out to them in love.

DivorceCare Seminar and Support Group

Starts September 22, 2006, 7-9pm



DivorceCare is a network of thousands of divorce recovery support groups meeting worldwide. The goal is to help people experiencing separation and divorce to find help for their hurts, discover hope for the future and experience God's healing.

Steve and Cheryl Grissom, both of who have been through divorce, founded Church Initiative, which publishes DivorceCare. Church Initiative is a non-denominational, nonprofit ministry that equips local churches to help people recover from life crises, such as separation and divorce.

The DivorceCare program takes a biblical approach to divorce, separation and related issues such as reconciliation, remarriage, forgiveness and the effect of divorce on children and families. DivorceCare emphasizes that real healing from the intense pain of divorce must begin with a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

This will be the first time MUMC is offering this ministry. We have much to learn. I ask that you take a minute to pray for this exciting and new undertaking.



Spotlight on Childcare

The time has come for all of us to think seriously about the childcare issues we are facing in our congregation. SPR has been working very hard to come up with a replacement for Jaclyn Rafter in the nursery, and another person in the toddler room, but have had no luck so far. On top of that, it is very important to offer babysitting for our special events and committee meetings. Here are a couple of reasons why:

- Parents of young children need a break. I can remember when my two girls were small and I thought I might possibly go crazy if I had to talk about Elmo for one more minute. If we offer childcare for meetings we get 2 things – a ministry to the parent by allowing them a break, and we get the benefit of their participation in our church. Most parents have worked before they had children and that knowledge/talent we can use in all areas of our church.
- We live in an area full of young people – the average age in the Souhegan Valley is 36. We know that all people need the Lord. When these people come to us, what support services do they need to be able to participate in our ministries? We've added driving ministry to help our older congregants to get to church and activities, we need to think about childcare so that our younger congregants can participate, as well.

So, now what do we do? We all need to help out in the nursery and toddler room until we can hire paid staff on Sunday morning, and we can take a turn volunteering as a babysitter for events or meetings. If all of us took one turn every 3 to 6 months we could form a rotation that would provide for our child care needs. Think about it, an hour or two every 6 months to provide a huge benefit to our congregation and community. And on top of that, little kids have great smiles!

Education

Vacation Bible School - After a few delays here and there, VBS 2006 - Trading Places finally took place the week of July 31st - Aug. 4th. With a low number of advance registrations, we were quite amazed to see at least 70 children each night and a total of 82 children registered overall. We danced, we sang, we ate some different snacks, we played games and did crafts but through it all we learned that "* No matter who you are or where you live, Jesus makes a world of difference. "

* The children collected items for an orphanage in a rural town in Brazil - Saint John Evangelista. Through the efforts of many we collected: 28 pairs of flip-flops, 51 boxes of crayons, 9 boxes of markers, 31 coloring books, 12 washcloths, 19 bars of soap, 6 tubes of toothpaste, 17 toothbrushes, 7 matchbox cars, 10 things of play-doh, 2 packages of stickers, 2 water bottles, 12 pencil sharpeners, 1 pencil box, 16 notebooks, 48 colored pencils, 131 pencils, 20 pens, 1 hair-brush, 5 small games, 1 puzzle, 1 journal, 3 frisbees, and 1 football. To top our mission project off, enough money was collected with a "noise collection" to cover the cost of shipping all of the items. We rejoice over the generosity shown and pray that these gifts touch the hearts of the children at Saint John Evangelista so that they too can know that indeed, Jesus makes a world of difference.

Community Health Day is Coming!

If someone close to you collapses as you are reading this, do you know how to help them? After calling 911, could you administer the life-saving technique of CPR (Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation)? Could you use an AED (Automated External Defibrillator)? Are you familiar with basic first aid?

Is someone in your family interested in babysitting? A Red Cross Babysitting Certificate can show that a person has received significant training in caring for children and responding quickly and correctly to any need.

These and other health-related subjects will be taught at our church by representatives of the Nashua chapter of the American Red Cross on Saturday, September 16th. This is open to all residents, young and old, of Milford and other towns.

Among other organizations present will be the Milford Ambulance Service which will offer a program on poison control and will have one of its vehicles here open for display.

An Emergency Response Vehicle used by the Red Cross at emergency scenes will be here for people to inspect also. A school bus safety course will be offered. Other organizations are still being contacted about their participating.

The costs for the training programs are well below normal:

CPR/AED Training is \$25.00 per person
First Aid Training is \$25.00 per person
CPR/AED/First Aid is \$40.00 per person
Babysitting Training is \$30.00 per person

It will be understandably helpful for the Red Cross in planning for personnel and materials to have an idea of the numbers of people who might attend, although walk-ins certainly will be welcome.

Please sign the sheets in the narthex indicating in which sessions you or your friends are interested, preferably by **Sunday, September 10**.

Members of the church will provide a light lunch from noon to 1:00 pm for a modest donation.

This program is sponsored by the Events Committee of the church to celebrate the opening of our new building and to serve the people of the communities around us.
