### Interfaith Council to offer Thanksgiving celebration

The Souhegan Valley Interfaith Council invites the community to join in a celebration of Thanksgiving. The program will be held at the Souhegan Valley Boys and Girls Club at the Amato Center on Mont Vernon St. (Route 13 N), Milford on Tuesday, Nov. 20 from 7 to 8 pm.

The well known Epiphany liturgical dancers from Wilton's Second Congregational Church will offer a moving program dramatizing God's bounty in movement and music.

The congregation will be invited to sing traditional and contemporary songs of thanksgiving. Short readings from various faith traditions will be offered. There will be a basket for voluntary donations for local outreach to families in need.

Thanksgiving handouts with puzzles and pictures to color will be available to youngsters, and yes, adults can do them too. For those who wish, there will be a "gratitude board" upon which you can place something written or drawn showing what you are grateful for. Light refreshments will follow. Invite a neighbor and join in the celebration.

### Reaching out beyond our congregation in Christian love and service.

**Habitat for Humanity** – As a covenant church we offer support by praying for the program, making monetary donations and helping to expand public awareness.

**GNIHN** – The Harvest Ball was a sold out event and generated much needed financial support for the AnneMarie House. By selling Halloween costumes and slushies at the Pumpkin Festival, we raised about \$1000, 80% of which was donated to AMH and 20% of which was paid to the DO-IT committee. We are currently collecting used ink cartridges for GNIHN. You may leave them in the Styrofoam box in the foyer. Our next volunteer week is December 16th-22nd. Please contact Tami Davis Betelak to volunteer for a time slot that week.

**Meals to Heal** – Meals are provided to those in need of temporary support for various reasons. Volunteers cook meals, or meals can be purchased at Humble Pie. This program is in need of a coordinator who notifies meal providers of a need. In the meantime, contact Wendy Getchell-Lacey if you would like to coordinate, provide meals, or know of someone in need.

**Visitation Team** – Members of the visitation team visit those who are confined to their residence. Again, this program is in need of a coordinator. Contact Wendy Getchell-Lacey if you are able to coordinate or if you are

willing to make brief visits to those in need.

**Prison Ministry** – Bob Levesque belongs to the Kairos prison ministry and is part of a team that visits with prisoners over the course of a weekend in order to provide spiritual guidance and invite the men to accept Jesus. The Outreach committee occasionally makes a financial donation to this ministry.

**SHARE** – For the month of November, we are collecting the following items for the SHARE food pantry: Spaghetti sauce, spaghetti, canned ravioli, beefaroni, stewed tomatoes, canned carrots, and canned yams. The Outreach committee buys provisions each month to supplement these donations and occasionally makes a financial donation to help SHARE with its financial commitments. A liaison from Outreach attends the SHARE committee meetings to gather information. There are many opportunities to help SHARE during the holidays while they collect, sort, and distribute food and gifts. Check the weekly bulletin for details.

**Operation Christmas Child** – Items will be collected in November by the Sunday school classes. Check with the Education Team for details.

**Salvation Army Bell Ringing** – Members of the Outreach committee coordinate volunteers from MUMC and other area churches who are willing to ring bells at various store locations to collect money for the Salvation Army. Twenty percent of the funds remain local to help the needy in our community. Information and sign up sheets will be available.

**Open Cupboard** – The Outreach committee occasionally buys provisions or makes monetary donations to the Open Cupboard food pantry located at the Sacred Heart church in Wilton. Expenses for October include coffee supplies for the coffee hour, and donations – made to Habitat for Humanity, SHARE, GNIHN, the Open Cupboard, and the Katrina mission trip.

## Holiday Candle

On Thanksgiving, we share a special meal with family and friends. Make this holiday candle as a festive centerpiece for your table.

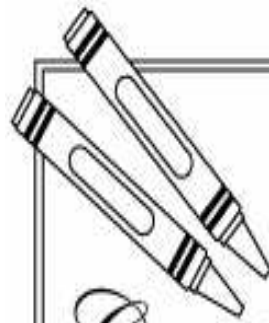
### What you need:

- Paper towel
- One 8-oz. clear plastic cup
- Petroleum jelly (Vaseline)
- Paper or plastic disposable bowl
- About 8 oz. of a variety of dried beans, peas, corn, etc.
- Bottle of white glue
- Plastic spoon
- An 8- to 10-inch taper or dinner candle
- Adult to help



### What you do:

1. Using the paper towel, rub a generous amount of petroleum jelly on the inside of the cup (bottom and sides).
2. In a bowl, pour the dried-bean mixture.
3. Squeeze enough glue into the bean mixture to generously coat it. Stir the mixture with the spoon.
4. Spoon about half of the bean mixture into the greased cup. Then place the candle, with any plastic wrapping removed, into the center of the mixture. Next, fill the cup with the rest of the mixture. Smooth the top to make it flat, making sure the candle stays straight.
5. Squeeze extra glue around the hole made by the candle. Let the bean mixture dry completely, which could take a day or longer.
6. When the bean mixture is dry, gently pull the candle. Both the candle and beans should come out as one. (If they don't, pour more glue and wait another day.)
7. Place your candle on a small plate for a festive Thanksgiving centerpiece.
